THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

The ceremony commences with the entrance of the academic procession where university dignitaries walk to the stage wearing traditional academic dress.

The procession consists of members of Murdoch's academic community with the highest ranking officials, the Chancellor, and Vice Chancellor and President following at the end.

The procession can also include representatives of other universities and dignitaries of local, state and national governments.



The Mace

The mace was originally a heavy club, often spiked, used in medieval warfare as a defensive weapon.

The term 'Chancellor' comes from the Latin 'cancellarius' meaning a gate-keeper. In other words, the Chancellor was the first line of defence when a castle or a city was attacked or besieged, and the mace was his formidably useful weapon.

Chancellors have retained the mace as their symbol of office and as a reminder that their function is to defend the University against influences hostile to their wellbeing. At important ceremonies the mace is carried before the Chancellor by a mace-bearer.

The Murdoch University mace was made by Simon Parsons, a Western Australian craftsman, using bush timber collected with respect to ecological good practice. The shaft is tuart and marri, with facings of jarrah, and the stand is jarrah. The mace was a gift from former Chancellor, the late Emeritus Professor Geoffrey Bolton AO, CitWA and Mrs Carol Bolton.



Education was the preserve of monasteries until the 12th century, when universities were established in Bologna and Paris, both cathedral cities.

The Masters and students were initially clerks or members of the clergy below the rank of priest. They dressed in a gown, hood and cap, as did their secular contemporaries, while the Doctors and Masters of Theology, the priests, wore a full cape. It was not until the late 14th century, however, that universities began to set rules and requirements for formal academic dress.

Traditionally, university gowns are made from silk. Today, university gowns are manufactured in synthetics and other substitutes, but silk is still used in some facings and sleeve linings. The hoods, which grew out of the practical all-weather covering, have now diversified in cut and linings to indicate various degrees and universities.

The colours of academic dress at universities are now fully codified and usually refer to a graduate's academic discipline or School. Doctors of Science, Literature and Veterinary Science, for example, wear scarlet festal gowns with facings and sleeve linings of green silk for the Degree of Doctor of Science, royal blue for the Degree of Doctor of Literature, purple for the Degree of Doctor of Veterinary Science, and white for Doctor of the University.



Recycling of Spent Cylindrical Lithium-ion Batteries - Hydrometallurgy Approach with Pretreatment

This thesis reports new technology for the recycling of cylindrical lithium-ion batteries (LiBs) to support closed-loop LiB production. Novel findings include a safe processing solution for collection and discharging of spent batteries, an alternative process for mineral liberation using semi-autogenous attrition, and hydrometallurgical process for extraction of the valuable elements using environmentally benign reagents. The outcome a novel, safe and green integrated technology for recycling LiBs, suitable for practical application.
